# AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION WINDOW EXHIBITS

Entries close November 1, 2020

The Agriculture school exhibit will be held in connection with the Pennsylvania Farm Show. The exhibit will be conducted as a contest among chapters of the Pennsylvania FFA Association. A maximum of 25 exhibits will be judged virtually.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Any FFA Chapter in Pennsylvania may enter this contest by submitting a completed entry form found at the PA FFA website, [www.paffa.org/](http://www.paffa.org/) association, Farm Show Documents, and return it to: PA FFA; Mike Brammer, PA FFA Executive Director, PO Box 61663, Harrisburg, PA 17106. The completed entry form **MUST** include a photo or sketch of the exhibit. Exhibits will be accepted which were not shown at local fairs or events.
2. Each exhibit must have unity, conveying one central idea based on an approved method or practice in Agriculture. It should be simple in form, have few signs and charts, and should not be crowded. It may be stationary or may have mechanical motion. The use of lights is strongly suggested.
3. A maximum of 25 exhibits will be judged virtually. Exhibits will **NOT** be brought to Harrisburg and displayed in the Farm Show Complex. Chapter exhibits may need to be set up in a school lobby or other location in order to be judged. The schools will be notified within five days of the entry deadline whether they have been accepted or not.
4. Each exhibit must be the original work of a Pennsylvania FFA Chapter. The construction of the exhibit must be entirely the work of FFA members of the chapter entering the exhibit. Portions of the exhibit may be commercially printed or printed by students in other classes at the school. Maximum size of these printed sections will be 3 feet by 3 feet. In no case may an entire panel be commercially printed or printed by students in another class.
5. Exhibits may not exceed 40 inches deep by 8 feet wide and may not be over 8 feet tall from the floor. Exhibits may be set on skirted tables, skirted sawhorses, or directly on the floor.
6. Chapters will be given a time to connect to Zoom for the judges to evaluate the exhibit. The Chapter Advisor and/or students should be available at this time to answer questions from the judges and, if needed, move the camera so all parts of the exhibit can be seen. Exhibits should be ready to be judged the week of January 4-8, 2021. All exhibits will be scored and placed.
7. A photo of the completed display must be submitted to [farmshow@pa.gov](mailto:farmshow@pa.gov) by January 4, 2021 to be used in Farm Show broadcasting.
8. A disqualification of a demonstration or exhibit will be made at the discretion of the department:
  - a Exhibits that were not the original work of the FFA Chapter or individual exhibitor.
  - b Consistent and flagrant violation of departmental rules that are not included as part of the evaluation and scoring process.
  - c Flagrant violation of the FFA Code of Conduct.
  - d Exhibits less than high quality for the PA Farm Show.
